Harbour House presents Rhys Morgan's LGBTQIA+ Sea Shanty choir performing Seaweed in the Fruit Locker on the main stage for Kingsbridge Celebrates Christmas, with FREE local mulled apple juice and creative sustainable food workshops by social art collective JarSquad in the gallery (12-3pm).

Morgan and the Seaweed in the Fruit Locker choir will be performing as part of the celebrations and their performance will include traditional festive shanties and a new shanty commissioned for Kingsbridge in response to local histories. A film documenting the performance will form the heart of our new exhibition, from 2nd December until 20th January 2024. There will also be an interactive activity in our resource area at the back of the gallery for audiences to write their own sea shanties.

Seaweed in the Fruit Locker explores lost histories and queer motifs within maritime history through the tradition of shanty singing. The choir use their lived experiences to rework existing shanties and inspire new ones responding to personal stories and local histories. They have performed across the South West and beyond and have featured in Rolling Stone, The Daily Telegraph and on Radio 4's The World at One.

Workshops

Rhys and the choir will be offering workshops to local LGBTQIA+ youth groups in Kingsbridge to create and sing their own takes on sea shanties, celebrating their lived experiences in joyful and musical ways.

JarSquad

JarSquad is a local, ongoing social art project turning surplus food into different preserves and jams; connecting the dots between food waste, climate action, and combating social isolation. The project not only explores a deep interest in tasty food, but also starts conversations around how we could be more active in promoting circular systems of food production, preservation, and communal abundance. They will be sharing their dried fruit produce and local mulled apple juice 12-3pm in the gallery, as part of Kingsbridge Celebrates Christmas.

Bowland Beth: Catherine Seymour and David Lefeber with Zoe Arshamian, Rob Godman and David Harsent

Bowland Beth is a collaboration between Kingsbridgebased choreographer Catherine Seymour and film maker David Lefeber, inspired by the poem 'Bowland Beth' by David Harsent, with a score composed by Rob Godman and danced by Zoe Arshamian. The poem is an elegy to Beth, a Hen Harrier born and tagged on the wild moors of the Forest Bowland, Lancashire and illegally shot before she could breed.

David Lefeber is a classical-music record producer/sound engineer and filmmaker, specialising in performance arts. His practice includes music-performance films and arts documentaries. Catherine Seymour is a local choreographer and resident yoga teacher at Harbour House. The intersection between arts and music is at the heart of her choreography practice.

Sky Dancer Workshops

Catherine will be leading several workshops relating to the exhibition and exploring the flight and life of the Hen Harrier and other birds via mark making and movement. We will be working with primary school children, students at KCC, and the over 55s, and finally an intergenerational workshop. We are working with an access specialist to ensure this experience is open to all, no dance experience required. We will share more information about these on our social media channels.

As part of Harbour House and Kingsbridge Community College continued partnership, KCC A-level students will be curating and installing an exhibition of their work across a range of media.

Year 12 students have focused on developing responses to the themes of 'Figures & Forms' 'Expressive Portraiture' and 'Still Life'. During the first 7 weeks of the A Level Art course, students took part in weekly Life Drawing classes held at Harbour House. This opportunity has enabled the students to explore an important art tradition and improve their observational skills. In Year 13, students pursue their own 'Personal Investigation' theme, exploring and developing their own ideas and practices informed by researching a range of artists & photographers.

Our Sixth Sense A Level exhibition will showcase a wide range of creative ideas, mediums and techniques explored by these talented sixth form students.
